Sugamya Pustakalaya is an inclusive library initiative in Moradabad, Uttar Pradesh, offering Braille books, audiobooks, assistive technologies, and personalized learning plans to support differently-abled students in accessing education and skill development.

Impact

It has benefitted 4,500+ students across four libraries, enhanced Braille literacy and sign language skills, trained 24 teachers in specialized education, and expanded access through assistive technologies and community involvement.

Impact







PMA 2024: Overall Performance of 13 Participating States on 08.10.2025




